Sky's the Limit bridges the Digital Divide in Ottawa

Toronto, ON, July 5th, 2007 – **Sky's the Limit Youth Organization (STL)**, a non-profit organization that provides refurbished computers to students from under-resourced communities in Toronto, announces their expansion to Ottawa. Joining forces with Ottawa's **CompuCorps Mentoring (CCM)** and **CNC Global Limited Ottawa**, Canada's leader in IT staffing solutions, STL will provide refurbished computers to deserving families in the Ottawa area.

This new initiative will target immigrant and low-income families with limited access to resources, specifically new Canadians arriving from Burma. Canada is playing a pivotal role in an international effort to provide solutions for Burmese refugees. There are about 1000 Burmese refugees in Ottawa and more are expected to arrive in 2007. Receiving adequate training and buying a new or refurbished computer is a challenge for most. Providing training along with technology facilitates access and usage for children and other family members in the home.

Having grown up in Kanata, Executive Director and Founder of STL, Lara Tavares, understands the importance and impact of having a computer in the home, "I really appreciated the opportunity to grow up in Canada's high-tech centre and my exposure to technology at a young age afforded me many opportunities as I ventured out into the world. I am excited to bring STL to Ottawa and offer access to computers and technology to help bridge the Digital Divide in this region."

The initiative will officially launch on August 23rd, 2007 from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. when CCM, CNC Global Limited and STL will distribute the first 20 computers at CCM's new facility in Ottawa at 1040 Somerset Avenue West, Ottawa. Each STL computer recipient will participate in a mentoring session provided by CCM and then take a computer home.
